
**Objectives**

- To share the Luarca Declaration on the Human Right to Peace with civil society, international organisations and academics from the Balkan region
- To identify strengths and weaknesses of the Luarca Declaration with the purpose of promoting a sustainable peace in the Balkan region
- To contribute to the elaboration of a draft universal declaration on the human right to peace which should represent the interest of the international civil society as a whole, included that of people from the South Eastern Europe region
- To examine in the context of the South Eastern Europe region the close relationship between the respect of all human rights –civil, political, social, economic and cultural and the right to development- and the fulfilment of the human right to peace
- To study the role played by vulnerable and marginalized groups in the development of the human right to peace in the Balkan region
- To analyse the impact of the gender approach in the promotion of the human right to peace in the Balkan region
- To examine the right of victims to know the truth, to access to justice and the right to obtain an effective remedy as a means to reach a sustainable and lasting peace in the Balkan region
